# **2024 VA Ancillary Benefits Increased and VA Disability Compensation Rates**

Effective October 1, 2023 the rates have increased for the Department of Veteran's Affair ancillary benefits. In order to be eligible for one or more of the ancillary benefits you must have a qualifying service-connected disability. For those of you that are entitled to the ancillary benefits, the new fiscal year 2024 amounts are listed below.

Specially Adaptive Housing (SAH) Grant: \$117,014.00 Special Housing Adaptation (SHA) Grant: \$23,444.00 SAH Temporary Residence Adaptation (TRA) Grant: \$47,130.00 SHA Temporary Residence Adaptation (TRA) Grant: \$8,415.00 Auto and Adaptive Equipment Grant: \$25,603.02 Clothing Allowance: \$999.51 Medal of Honor pension: \$1671.16

In addition, Effective December 1, 2023 your monthly Veterans disability compensation rates have gone up. If you are rated at 100% or below you can look up your new monthly benefit amount on <u>https://</u> <u>www.va.gov/disability/compensation-rates/veteran-rates/</u>. If you are receiving 100% disability with any level of Special Monthly Compensation you can look up your new monthly benefit amount on <u>https://</u> <u>www.va.gov/disability/compensation-rates/special-monthly-compensation-rates/</u>.



Nevada PVA offers two (2) annual full-time scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 each. It is open to any student attending a college or university as long as they are a member or a family member of a Nevada PVA member. Deadline for application submission is **June 30, 2024** and awards will be made in August in time for the fall semester. The money will be sent directly to the college or university. # **PVA Releases 2024 Policy Priorities**

The second session of the 118th Congress is officially underway. This year, we will continue to work with our champions on pushing forward legislation and regulations that support our priorities. Congress will be in session fewer days this year than last year because of the pending November elections. Regardless, we will work to push access forward this year and believe we will see some of our key priorities over the finish line.

Our priorities for this year are as follows:

- Protect Access to VA's Specialized Health Care Services
- Expand Access to VA Long-Term Services and Supports
- Improve VA Benefits and Health Care Services for Paralyzed Veterans and their Survivors
- Protect the Civil Rights of People with Disabilities
- Improve Access to Social Security Benefits

Don't forget about our Step Outside Program. This program will pay you up to \$100 per quarter for you to get out and about in the community. We are starting a new year so there is \$400 available to each of our members for participating in this Program. See details below:

# Policy Title: Step Outside Program (formerly Entertainment Reimbursement)

Date Adopted/Revised: August 8, 2007 (updated November 2018)

The Chapter will fund the member and one (1) guest for participation in or attending Basketball, Soccer, Bowling etc., events or will reimburse the member and one (1) guest to attend shows, movies, plays or lunch/dinner, in a sit-down "full service" restaurant.

The amount of the funding will be capped at \$100.00 per quarter, per member.

In order to have access to these funds, the member must submit receipts and a short review of the event attended, which will be placed in the newsletter. Receipts and the review **must be** submitted within three (3) weeks of having attended the event in order to be eligible for reimbursement.

This program is designed to get our members out and about in a social setting.

**ADDENDUM**: You do not need to spend \$100.00 on any one event, the money is \$100.00 **per quarter** so if you pay \$10.00 ten times for movies you still get the funding. However, you must submit the receipt and the **write up** within three weeks of the event. **DO NOT SAVE YOUR RECEIPTS UNTIL YOU ACCUMULATE \$100.00, NEVADA PVA WILL KEEP TRACK OF THE FUNDS**.

Below is an example of a write up one of our members submitted in order to get his \$100.
