#### President's Message

The Nevada Chapter has had another great year, we are now trying to get members from Mesquite, Nevada.

We did a number of John Rumsfield's radio shows. He does public Service Announcements (30 minutes each) and this has really helped the chapter. The radio station he uses has approximately 1100 stations nationwide and we have received calls from all over the country. I am sure this also assists other chapters in states they cover as we refer potential members to the appropriate chapter in their area.

We took part in Public Awareness Week (PAW) and sponsored a "A Day in a Wheelchair" in which managers from various organizations worked one day in a wheelchair and then they wrote an article for our newsletter on their experience.

We had a great fishing trip on Lake Mead this past June. It was really a lot of fun, the boat I was on caught three strippers and we skunked the other boat which, I might add, was being piloted by non other than our Executive Director, Julie Johnson. We had plenty of food on each boat along with plenty of drinks to hydrate everyone in our warm weather (it was about 92 degrees).

We participated in a Veterans Stand Down that the total cost was about \$250 (see what happens when veterans organizations get together with a common goal). It only lasted one day but we saw approximately 300+ homeless/displaced veterans. We were amazed at how much we accomplished, as previously, we had two day events for the summer, which costs much more money and we didn't see that many more veterans. I want to thank Catholic War Veterans, VFW, American Legion, DAV, all these organizations came from all over Las Vegas, Henderson and Boulder City. This was also prior to our harsh winter. We found that the Stand Down was much more beneficial held in the winter than in the summer. It was an extremely good learning experience for all the organizations.

Pappas Motor S ports held a fund raiser for us at the Raceway during the "Bullring" Races (all types of stock cars) all disabled veterans were let in for free (saved a \$10 fee) and we had a great car show, which was the actual fundraiser, we felt we did much better because of the number of people who go to the races.

We had a great veterans motorcycle run that was put on by the VFW, NV PVA, American Legion, and was a great success.

Our car donation program is doing well, considering the hard times that have hit Nevada as we are considered the 5th worst economy in the world, yes, Nevada is number 5, but the positive is that over the past four years, the donation program has brought in approximately \$250,000. The program had some new licensing requirements which made us jump through hoops because the city needed extra money so they made all 501(c)(3) dealers get a new license. I went to the city and got the fee waived for a fire impection which costs about \$350 and truly was unnecessary. I guess the clerk agreed with me because he waived the fee.

We participated in two fundraisers at the San Gennaro Feast, where we had a booth and received donations for cold bottled water and this time we made more money than we ever have in the past. We had many volunteers working the booth as the feast last for a week.

We continued with our annual pizza party at the Nevada State Veteran's Home, it was really great to help those older veterans and they really appreciate us showing up. We had quite a few women this year, and again, our volunteer base was great at helping us out.

We finished the year by adopting five veterans and their families from the Help Genesis Apartments. We provided food, clothing, hygiene products, shoes and toys, if the veterans had children. It is really rewarding to see the expressions on their faces when they receive their gifts. This year we also teamed with Nellis Air Force Base who sponsored a group of veterans on their own.

We ended the year by having a Christmas Party, along with the Reno members having a Christmas Party the same day. We had the best turn out we have ever had, including our SCI doctor, nurse and social worker.

This year we are using a slogan we established at the Board of Director's Meeting, being the economy is such, we need to "think outside the box" for many of our events and fundraisers.

#### Advocacy Report

I participated in a teleconference with the Committee on Judiciary at the Grant Sawyer Building on AB223 which provides protection for Federal Benefit recipients from attachment of exempt funds streamlining the process for these already exempt funds. I did quite a bit of research on not only non-service connected PVA members but other disabled veterans from various organizations and found that banks were allowing attachment of funds directly deposited from the U.S. Treasury Department. These were Social Security and VA disability payments. It was found that many of the people, because of the bad economy in Las V egas, have closed their bank accounts and receive their benefit checks at home and cashed them and keep the cash around. This creates a big problem with burglary and robberies, along with injuries received by the recipients of these checks. The Judiciary Committee had passed this law two years ago, but the previous Governor had vetoed the bill. Because we now have a new Governor the bill now has a good chance of passing.

#### Benefits and Liaison

Over the past year, NV PVA has been in contact with 2,278 veterans. Total issues filed totaled 421. Nevada PVA's accomplished wins for veterans in the past year totaled \$4,178,154, of that \$2,221,644 were for spinal cord injured or diseased veterans. We also had a significant number of retroactive awards that were granted, 27 in all totaling \$1,953,479.

During this time, the Service Officer traveled 6,854 miles on company business. At this time we are the only veteran's organization that when called by the various hospitals around town to notify us of veterans in the hospital, we actually go there and help walk them through the enrollment process, step-by-step.

Nevada PVA has gotten homeless veterans off the streets and either into the state home in Boulder City or has gotten their claims processed, and they have received their money and are nowable to have a home. We assist getting them benefits to keep them off the streets or if they are poverty stricken to help them survive with a better quality of life.
