We held our Annual BBQ at Floyd Lamb State Park and everyone had a great time, we had the best ribs ever! #### Legislative Report

Last year we worked with various Home Owner Associations (HOA) to get their CC&R's changed to waive certain requirements to make them more ADA friendly. They either changed or waived the provisions complying with ADA requirements. Some of these requirements were, if a person had a manual or power chair, if the home caught fire and the CCR's stated that there can be no concrete paving along the side of the houses. This prevents egress through the back yard for people in chairs. Most HOA's have only one sidewalk on the street side and this makes it difficult for homeowners to get to their mail boxes. We found out that this is not the Post Office's responsibility, but that of the HOA.

We worked with various gun stores that were having Concealed Weapons Training to change their format for those Quads that cannot hold a pistol in one hand and then use the other. The State Law read that you must be able to shoot using either hand, but, they finally agreed to change the law and now a Quad can use the hand of their choice. We also worked with the news media regarding persons in wheelchairs use of concealed firearms for protection.

We attended a County Legislative meeting regarding trying to get a reduction in costs for disabled veterans vehicle plates, as Nevada charges the same price as vanity plates. Because of budget concerns, this was taken off the table.

We participated in a teleconference with our State Legislative Committee (Judicial Committee) in Carson City, Nevada regarding bill AB 223. This bill provides protection for Federal Benefit recipients from the attachment of the Department of Treasury Funds streamlining the process for those already exempt funds. We did quite a bit of research on both service connected and non-service connected veterans and checked with every veterans organization in Nevada. Veterans were closing their bank accounts and receiving their benefit checks at home, when they cash the checks, this creates a big problem with robberies and burglary along with injuries to the recipients of the checks. This law was passed two years ago but the Governor vetoed it. This year the bill was signed by the Governor.

We worked on the Veterans's Administration vouchersystem which considers Aide and Attendant as part of the income and they take out a percentage of it, as if it were income. We brought this to the attention of Congresswoman Shelley Berkley and Senator Harry Reid and they said they would look into it.

This past year we worked with some of the local casinos as well as some of the small stores in an attempt to bring them up to ADA standard. Some of the issues we worked on with them were adding parking spaces (one casino added ten new handicap spots including three for van access; also inappropriate parking spaces, lack of cross walks and excessive curb blocking wheelchair access. I also contacted a local TV station and newspaper suggesting they have articles and features on the importance of wheelchair access in the community and the importance of meeting and enforcing ADA laws.

Over the past year, the Nevada PVA National Service Office has been in contact with 1,893 veterans and family members, of which 1,111 were member or member eligible.

The office was active filing claims for veterans and their family members totaling 358 new issues over the past year. Although many claims are still pending, a total of \$2,616,614 in retroactive dollars was won for our clients.

Due to the efforts of the service office and the outreach of the Chapter, a total of 79 new Power of Attorney (POA) clients were added to the roster this past year. Continued efforts are being conducted to seach our new veterans coming out of the service today and also to reach the veterans who have been forgotten or neglected by the VA. We will continue to work closely with the Chapter in their outreach events and help spread the word of the service we provide to veterans and their families.

#### Sports Report

Once again we joined the PVA Trap Shoot Circuit and hosted the Nevada PVA Trap Shoot. We had a good turnout for the event and the weatherwas great.

We once again invited our members to come out for our Annual Fishing Trip on Lake Mead. We sented several boats to accommodate everyone and, even though, no fish were caught this year, everyone enjoyed the camaraderie and a day in the sun selaxing.
