#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S OPINION

In my opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Nevada Paralyzed Veterans of America as of December 31, 2012, and the changes in its net assets, and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
