Help Heal Veterans donated 200 therapeutic craft kits to help fill the bags.



Wellness Group

No one understands why I get upset when I have trouble transferring in and out of my mobility device, or putting on my shoes and socks. How about the ability to navigate going in and out of a building. The lack of bowel and bladder control. Plus all of the other problems that are a result of your injury or disease.

The VA will send you to a psychologist to deal with this problem. Their way of helping is to ask you: "Well how should you react to your problem?"

That's a big help. There is a solution.

The Wellness Group at the Veterans Hospital of Southern Nevada.

The Wellness Group meets every Monday at 11 A.M. in Building 5, 1st floor room next to the elevators.

What is the Wellness Group? It is a group of veterans who have various injuries and diseases that meet and discuss living with their problems. There are paraplegics, amputees, MS and other muscular disease patients. We are facilitated by VA employees, but the group dictates what the topic of discussion will be. Speakers come in from different departments of the hospital: pharmacy, nutrition, prosthetics, recreational activities available. Plus whatever other department the vets would like to hear from.

We also have discussions on how we individually handle different situations. The program is very beneficial, not just physically, but maybe even more so; mentally.

Talk to your primary care doctor or just stop in and participate in one of our meetings on a Monday at 11 A.M. Spouses and caregivers are welcome to attend also. They can get questions answered by other spouses and caregivers that attend. See you there.


